# Welcome

## A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTORS —

The multicultural utopia we crave in Australia is a fragile thing which requires nourishment now more than ever. JIFF 2025 presents 50 new films that provide a glimpse into the Jewish experience, with all its achievement, grappling and diversity of opinion.

We present films about seminal Jewish people, such as Elie Wiesel, Jerry Lewis, Art Spiegelman, Sigmund Freud, Claude Lelouch, Andy Kaufman, Franz Kafka and Joseph Bau.

We showcase the latest crop of Israeli films, including *Pink Lady*, winner of Best Director at Tallinn Film Festival, and box office hits *The Ring*, *Matchmaking 2*, *The Property*, *Soda*, and Israeli Oscar winner *Come Closer*.

Our blockbusters include the American indie smash *Bad Shabbos*, the French box office hit *Once Upon My Mother*, and *Eleanor the Great*, which premiered at Cannes and is Scarlett Johansson's directorial debut, starring the phenomenal 95-year-old June Squibb.

Our special presentation of Richard Linklater's masterful *Blue Moon*, a prize winner at the Berlinale, features Jewish creatives at the heart of the early Broadway musicals: Rodgers, Hart and Hammerstein.

We continue to champion Yiddish culture with a new restoration of one of the first Yiddish talkies, *I Have Sinned*, starring Rachel Holzer, who became a star of the Yiddish theatre in Australia. We also present a unique program of Yiddish-language horror shorts.

We continue to embrace new mediums,

with a binge-watch of the TV show *The Zweiflers*, called 'the German Succession' and recent winner of best series at the prestigious Cannes Series competition.

JIFF spotlights films which reflect on the persecution of Jewish peoples, with *A Letter to David* and *Holding Liat* examining the aftermath of October 7, and *The Disappearance of Josef Mengele*, *Among Neighbors*, *Riefenstahl* and *The Eichmann Trial* offering new perspectives on the Holocaust.

We present a new digital print of Claude Lanzmann's epic *Shoah*, one of the greatest films of all time. Celebrating its 40th anniversary, *Shoah* changed the public perception of the Holocaust and the way films about historical horrors are made. Its companion piece, the acclaimed *All I Had Was Nothingness*, premiered at the Berlinale and recounts the dramatic making of Lanzmann's masterpiece.

As a launchpad for local productions, JIFF is proud to present the Australian premiere of Frank Lowy's *To Be a Jew*, a special Work-in-Progress screening of Esther Takac's *RISING: Voices of Protest and Hope*, the story of Holocaust survivor and Aussie musical icon Tommy Tycho, and screenings of the completed films of the 2025 Short Film Fund recipients, funded by JASF and JIFF.

Now more than ever, welcome all. See you at the movies.

## Opening Night Film — Bad Shabbos

David and his fiancée Meg are nervously anticipating Shabbat dinner at David’s parents’ Manhattan apartment. The pressure is high because Meg’s Catholic parents are flying in from Wisconsin to meet David’s whole family. They’ve barely blessed the challah before an accident happens, and a dead body turns up in the powder room. Or was it murder? What will they do with the corpse? And how long can the Gelfands keep this a secret from Meg’s pious parents?

Hilarious and rapidly paced, *Bad Shabbos* took home the Audience Award at Tribeca Film Festival for its keenly observed comedy about faith, family foibles and crisis management. The fantastic ensemble cast includes several familiar faces like Kyra Sedgwick (*The Closer*) and Australian Ashley Zukerman (*Succession*), with a memorable turn from Wu-Tang Clan rapper Cliff ‘Method Man’ Smith as the friendly doorman who lends a hand to his favourite tenants.

## Special Presentation — Eleanor the Great

After a devastating loss, Eleanor, a sassy, wise-cracking 94-year-old, moves from Florida to New York City to live with her daughter Lisa and grandson Max. To encourage her out of the house, Lisa suggests Eleanor visit the local Jewish community centre to make some new friends. There, Eleanor accidentally winds up in a Holocaust support group where she tells a moving story of survival and resilience. But there’s one small problem — the story isn’t hers.

June Squibb (*Nebraska*, *Thelma*) is perfectly cast to bring this bold and brassy nonagenarian to life. At the heart of the film is a charming intergenerational friendship between Eleanor and Nina, a young journalism student who’s inspired to write an article about Eleanor’s story. This heartwarming comedy marks an assured debut in the director’s chair from Scarlett Johansson, exploring themes of ageing, truth, loss and our human impulse to tell stories.

## Spotlight on Claude Lanzmann — All I Had Was Nothingness

This reverential and thrilling documentary is tantamount to an unofficial “making of” film of the monumental 1985 Holocaust documentary *Shoah* by Claude Lanzmann, also screening at IJFF 2025. Pieced together from over 220 hours of Lanzmann’s own unused footage, it grants fresh perspective on the filmmaker’s process, setbacks and philosophical musings over the 12 years it took to make his most defining work.

Unlike *Shoah*, Lanzmann is present in almost every shot of this film, and director Guillaume Ribot uses passages from Lanzmann’s memoir, ‘The Patagonian Hare’, as narration. This reveals the unseen work that went into making *Shoah*, including Lanzmann’s filmmaking methods, struggles obtaining financing, and covert tactics used to gain access to interviewees such as fake passports and hidden cameras, sometimes landing Lanzmann in volatile situations when these tactics are discovered.

Providentially, this year marks 40 years since *Shoah* released, 80 years since the end of World War II and what would have been Lanzmann’s 100th birthday.

## Spotlight on Claude Lanzmann — Shoah

This nine-hour epic is one of the greatest cinematic achievements of all time, newly restored for its 40th anniversary.

Twelve years in the making, *Shoah* was born from director Claude Lanzmann’s concern that the Holocaust was fading from the collective memory, a mere 40 years after World War II ended. To counteract this, he patiently and persistently filmed interviews with survivors, bystanders and perpetrators across 14 countries about what they witnessed and experienced during the Holocaust.

Notably, Lanzmann resisted using any archival material, preferring instead to juxtapose interview footage with shots of key Holocaust locations as they appeared in the present – train tracks overgrown by grass and shells of buildings in bucolic landscapes.

Simultaneously epic and intimate, this monumental masterpiece redefined not only documentary filmmaking, but also public perception of the Holocaust more broadly. In 2023, UNESCO added the restored 35mm negative of *Shoah* to the Memory of the World international register.

## Among Neighbors

In the sleepy rural town of Gniewosów, Poland, Catholics and Jews co-existed peacefully for hundreds of years before WWII. Today, there isn't a single Jewish resident in the town. When descendants of some former Jewish residents travel to Gniewosów from San Francisco to explore their family history, they uncover long-repressed stories of violence that occurred there, even months after the war ended.

Seamlessly integrating present-day interviews with archival materials and vivid animation, this award-winning documentary focuses on the last living Holocaust survivor from the town (who now lives in Israel) and a woman who saw Jewish people murdered by their Polish neighbours when she was young. This eyewitness risks her life to tell her story, as it's now illegal under today's far-right Polish government to accuse the country of complicity in the Holocaust, but she hopes to learn the fate of a Jewish boy she loved over 70 years ago.

## Art Spiegelman: Disaster is My Muse

Art Spiegelman's Pulitzer Prize-winning graphic novel *Maus* — an autobiographical memoir about Spiegelman's relationship with his father, a Holocaust survivor — pioneered the appreciation of comic books as a serious artform. It came to define Spiegelman's career, however the full scope of his artistic output is more significant than many realise.

This conversational documentary brings you up-close with the artist and his life, revealing Spiegelman's early love of Mad magazine, his mother's tragic death by suicide when he was 20, his prolific artistic collaborations with his wife, Françoise Mouly, art editor of *The New Yorker*, and his work responding to the September 11 attacks, *In the Shadow of No Towers*.

Through extensive interviews with Spiegelman and those close to him, including comic book royalty Robert Crumb and Aline Kominsky-Crumb (who died in 2022), the film celebrates Spiegelman's particular brand of mordant humour and his talent for turning tragedy into profound works of art.

## Avenue of the Giants

An unlikely but powerfully healing friendship forms between a teenager and a Holocaust survivor in this gentle, moving film.

Herbert (Stephen Lang, *Avatar*) is an elderly shopkeeper who has just been diagnosed with a terminal illness. At the hospital, he crosses paths with teenager Abby (Elsie Fisher, *Eighth Grade*) who has recently had her own brush with pain and death. As an experiment, Abby’s therapist encourages Abby and Herbert to exchange their stories with one another.

Slowly but surely, these two souls begin to open up to each other and Herbert reveals a long-held secret that he’s kept from everyone, even his own family, for over 50 years: that he escaped from the Auschwitz Birkenau concentration camp when he was just a teenager.

Based on a true story, *Avenue of the Giants* is a testament to the power of sharing our struggles and the enriching possibilities of intergenerational friendship.

## Bau, Artist at War

Against all odds, the true love story between Joseph Bau and Rebecca Tennenbaum blossomed in the depths of the Holocaust. A gifted artist, Bau risked his life to help others by forging documents for those who managed to escape the camps. While in the Kraków-Plaszów concentration camp, operated by Oskar Schindler, Bau fell in love with fellow prisoner, Rebecca Tennenbaum. The two were married in a secret ceremony in the camp, a defiant act of love that was depicted in *Schindler’s List*.

Shot in luminous black and white, this film tells Bau’s extraordinary story of hope, resistance and survival, portrayed stirringly by Emile Hirsch (*Into the Wild*) and Inbar Lavi (*Fausta*) as Rebecca. Both a daring espionage thriller and a gripping war drama, this film is a testament to the resilience of the human spirit and the unbreakable bonds of love that even war can’t destroy.

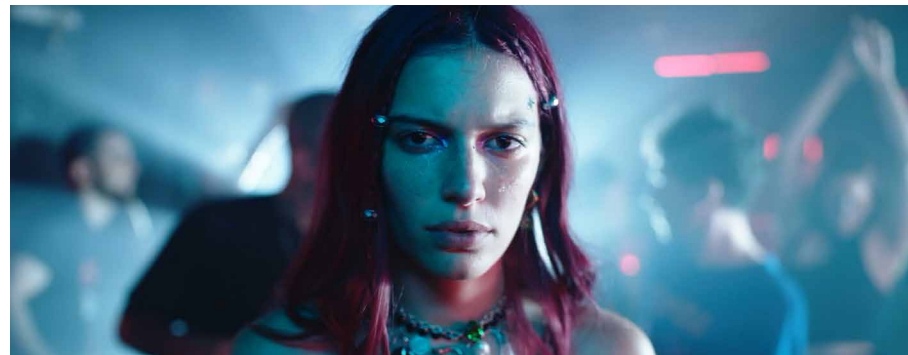

One for the Francophiles and cinephiles, this documentary allows Lelouch to tell his own life story, discussing his philosophies on art and filmmaking, his triumphs and regrets. ## Festival Highlight — The Disappearance of Josef Mengele

Based on the award-winning novel by Olivier Guez, *The Disappearance of Josef Mengele* imagines the postwar life of the infamous Nazi officer whose horrific medical experiments on prisoners at Auschwitz earned him the nickname ‘Angel of Death’. It follows Mengele’s time spent hiding out in Argentina, Paraguay and Brazil under a series of aliases, growing increasingly paranoid as he kept constant vigilance for Mossad officers hunting him down. When his son, Rolf, finds him again after years spent apart, Mengele is forced to confront the past he can no longer outrun.

Directed by Russian dissident filmmaker Kirill Serebrennikov, who relocated to Germany after his country invaded Ukraine, this is a highly stylised film shot almost entirely in striking black-and-white and using immersive extended takes. August Diehl (*A Hidden Life*) gives an impeccable performance in the lead role as one of the most reviled figures in world history.

## The Eichmann Trial

Constructed entirely from archival footage of the trial itself and contemporaneous news coverage, *The Eichmann Trial* documents the prosecution of Adolf Eichmann in Jerusalem in 1961. After being apprehended in Buenos Aires, the former Nazi officer was taken to Jerusalem to face justice. The entire court proceedings, lasting almost four months, were filmed and broadcast on televisions around the world – for many, this was the first time they’d come to understand the full extent of the Nazi atrocities during World War II.

An editor by trade, this is Elliot Levitt’s debut feature as director, but his editing skills shine in this story assembled from thousands of hours of footage. Levitt situates us in 1961 so concretely, it’s almost as if we’re watching the trial unfold in real time. This is a profound return to a pivotal moment not only in legal history but also for Holocaust awareness and education.

## Elie Wiesel: Soul on Fire

With unprecedented archival access, this poignant documentary uses family photographs, recordings of Wiesel’s own voice, original interviews and striking hand-painted animation to create a holistic portrait of a notoriously private man who became one of the world’s most public Holocaust survivors.

From Darkness to Light

It features interview footage with the comedian before his death in 2017, plus interviews with Martin Scorsese, Mel Brooks and actor Harry Shearer, one of the few to see a rough cut of *The Day the Clown Cried* in 1979.

The documentary also shows never-before-seen footage from Lewis’s film, which was once thought lost but was rescued by a Swedish film lab assistant, where the film was marked “to be destroyed”.

## Holding Liat

The hora dance is a staple at Jewish weddings and other celebrations, but how did it come into existence? This entertaining documentary delves into the one-hundred-year history of the hora and how Israeli folk dancing formed out of a collective desire for a new national culture, melding elements from the diverse ethnicities and influences that Israeli people brought with them.

*Hora* combines vivid archival footage with artful animations, interviews with choreographers and dance teachers, and present-day footage from dance rehearsals, festivals and performances. It explores how the chain of the hora connects not only individual people with their community by physically linking them together, but it also connects the distant past with the present as the dances are passed on from one generation to the next.

## Retrospective — I Have Sinned (Al Khet)

A treasure of early cinema out of circulation for generations, this is the first Yiddish sound film made in Poland. The debut film appearance of comedy duo Shimon Dzigan and Israel Schumacher, the “Yiddish Abbott and Costello”, it also stars Rachel Holzer, who became the queen of Yiddish theatre in Melbourne after she came to Australia from Poland in 1939.

In a small town during World War I, the local rabbi’s daughter falls pregnant to a German Jewish officer, but when the officer dies in battle, she abandons her child, fleeing to America as the town is evacuated before the Russian advance. Szamaj and Awrejmel (Dzigan and Schumacher) find the baby left alone, resolving to reunite it with its mother, no matter what it takes.

The new 4K restoration is thanks to a mammoth project undertaken by the US-based National Center for Jewish Film, using original 35mm film materials.

Both a globetrotting search for long-lost treasure and a concert film, this documentary tells the incredible story of a group of historians, record collectors and musicians rediscovering and reviving Jewish music from 1930s Berlin.

On Kristallnacht, the night of November 9, 1938, Nazis violently attacked Jewish people and businesses in Germany, including the two Jewish-run record companies in Berlin at the time, Semer and Lukraphon. Almost all of the companies’ original music materials, lyrics and sheet music were destroyed.

Committed detective work on the part of historians and record collectors interviewed in the film has led to the rediscovery and painstaking reassembly of shellac records (pre-dating vinyl records) found in collections across the globe. Today, this historic music lives on through the Berlin-based Semer Ensemble, a group of musicians who have revived and reinterpreted the unearthed recordings, performing them live for audiences around the world.

## Kafka's Last Trial

In his will, Franz Kafka instructed his friend and fellow writer Max Brod to destroy his unfinished works, including the manuscripts for his now celebrated novels *The Trial*, *The Castle* and *Amerika*. But Brod, in a notorious act of “benevolent betrayal”, refused and had Kafka’s works published between 1925 and 1935. Nearly a century later, an international lawsuit probes the rightful ownership of Kafka’s manuscripts. Do they belong in Israel, where Kafka dreamed of living but never entered, or Germany where his three sisters perished in the Holocaust?

An ironically Kafkaesque tale of a family pitted against faceless bureaucracy, *Kafka’s Last Trial* unravels the knots of this convoluted legal battle, playing out like a detective thriller full of unexpected twists and turns. This riveting documentary is a well-constructed collage of expressionistic animation, testimonials and Kafka’s original texts, which took home Best Documentary at the Haifa Film Festival.

## The Last Spy

Peter Sichel, who was known to his friends as the “Jewish James Bond”, was one of the earliest recruits to the CIA, becoming the agency’s first station chief in postwar Berlin. This riveting documentary tells Sichel’s extraordinary life story, which intersected directly with many key historical events from World War II to the Cold War.

Aged 100 years old at the time of the interviews in the film (Sichel died in early 2025 at 102 years old) but still sharp as a tack, Sichel recounts his years as a CIA spymaster in Berlin, Washington and Hong Kong with a frank directness and a gleefully wicked sense of humour. As a German-Jewish man who fled Europe with his family before World War II broke out and worked as a covert operative during the early days of the Cold War, Sichel’s wisdom and insight into today’s global conflicts carry significant weight.

Back in 2013, twin brothers David and Eitan Cunio starred in Tom Shoval’s debut feature film, *Youth*, which focuses on two brothers who kidnap a schoolmate in a misguided attempt to help their family out of debt. Ten years later, in a cruelly ironic case of art mirroring life, David Cunio became a hostage himself when he was abducted from the Nir Oz kibbutz by Hamas on October 7, 2023, and has been held in Gaza ever since.

Produced by Nancy Spielberg (Steven Spielberg’s sister) and Gal Greenspan, this personal cinematic letter from Shoval to his friend and former collaborator had its world premiere at the Berlin International Film Festival 2025. Notably, it avoids using any violent footage from October 7 but instead brings a profoundly human story to the tragedy, using unedited behind-the-scenes footage, audition tapes and interviews with David’s family.

Desperate to protect her family from scandal, Bati tries everything to seduce her husband back to their marital bed. A key player in these war crimes was Bruno Lohse, an SS officer who became the art agent in Paris for Hermann Göring, one of the most powerful figures in the Nazi party. Despite being captured and interrogated by the Monuments Men, Lohse was acquitted and spent decades secretly dealing stolen art to some of the world’s most notable galleries.

Our guide through this fascinating story is historian Jonathan Petropoulos, who wrote the book *Göring’s Man in Paris: The Story of a Nazi Art Plunderer and His World*, for which he interviewed Lohse dozens of times before his death in 2007. Petropoulos recounts the cat-and-mouse game he played with Lohse, leading to jaw-dropping discoveries of collusion with galleries and auction houses, and paintings stashed in bank vaults around Europe.

## To be a Jew. Frank Lowy in his own words.

Sir Frank Lowy has lived many lives. Born in Slovakia in 1930, he lost his father in the Holocaust, he fought in the Arab-Israeli War in 1948 and left Israel in 1952 for Australia to join family members who had settled in Sydney. There, Lowy met fellow immigrant John Saunders and together they opened their first shopping centre in Sydney in 1959, which led to the multi-billion-dollar international shopping centre empire, Westfield Corporation.

At the age of 88, Lowy decided to return to Israel to live there for the remainder of his life. Through archival footage and intimate testimony, this documentary sees Lowy reflecting on his long life as he approaches his 95th birthday. He considers what has shaped his resilience and his indelible Jewish identity, and faces the confronting aftermath of the Hamas attacks by visiting massacre sites and meeting with survivors.

TYCHO! Beyond the Baton

If you aren't familiar with Tommy Tycho, you've definitely heard one of his musical arrangements many times throughout your life. His arrangement of Australia's national anthem is the official version played at major sporting and community events to this day.

From the late 1950s to the early 2000s, Tycho, a Holocaust survivor from Budapest, was the preeminent musical director in Australia and one of the most accomplished musicians in the country. He was one of the earliest faces seen on Australian television as Channel 7's first musical director in 1956. He composed over 3000 musical compositions and arrangements throughout his life and toured as a musical director and accompanist for artists like Frank Sinatra, Roy Orbison, Sammy Davis Jr and many more.

Through archival materials and interviews with an array of famous faces from Australia's music industry, including Julie Anthony, Barry Crocker, James Morrison, Todd McKenney and Rhonda Burchmore, this documentary celebrates the indelible mark Tycho left on our country's cultural landscape.

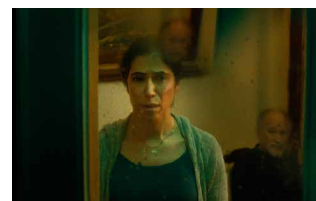

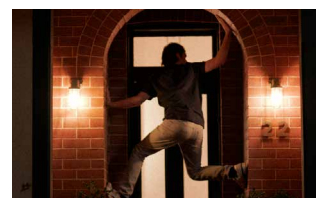
